Dr. Steven Pribanich, family medicine physician and owner of Plateau Medical Specialists in Crossville is the 2018 Lincoln Memorial University DeBusk College of Osteopathic Medicine Preceptor of the Year. Dr. Pribanich is a member of the active medical staff at Cumberland Medical Center, an affiliate of Covenant Health, East Tennessee's top performing healthcare network and also provides inpatient care at Cumberland Medical Center with the TeamHealth Hospitalist Department.

Those that work with Pribanich say he exudes a love for teaching students and appreciates the challenge students present to him to stay current and on top of new information. For his part, Pribanich considers himself a community preceptor and a teaching physician. "I can't imagine my office without medical students," Pribanich said. "My patients love the students, for which I am very grateful, because without them none of this would be possible."

Students have praised Pribanich in their post-rotation evaluations. "Dr. Pribanich was one of my favorite preceptors...it was a pleasure getting to work with him. The rotation was excellent, and I feel ten times more prepared than I did before rotating with him," one student wrote. Another said, "Dr. Pribanich gives his students a tremendous amount of responsibility and allows you to work cases from start to finish. He is a great instructor on EMR and the process of medical billing." Pribanich feels students are well prepared for the COMLEX PE exam after rotating in his office and experiencing his routine for patient encounters and patient care. Many of his medical students have told Pribanich that their family medicine rotation with him has reinforced their decision to make a career in medicine was a wise choice.
